

POSITION PAPER

Remember a position paper it's not a complete research, but a way to break down the topic to analyze it and bring up a solution according to the belief of a country.

Concentrate your efforts in a solution-focused paper.

In order to have a concise, complete and organized paper you can write it in four sections.

A. OUTLINE THE TOPIC IN GENERAL;

Even if it is tempting to know everything about the topic, like what's happening, who is involved and all the issues around it keep in mind that maybe that information is better for debate rather than your paper.

For this section the purpose it is to provide insight into the root of the conflict. Starting with areas of concern, discussing some of the positive and negative aspects, as well as emphasizing the controversial nature of the topic. This paragraph should show a brief summary of the current perception of the problem and express why it is significant.

B. IDENTIFY AND DESCRIBE YOUR COUNTRY;

Ask yourself how has your country been affected? Once you understand how your nation relates to the conflict explain how the topic has altered the domestic dynamics of the country. Describe which changes take place and avoid the normative judgments.

C. COUNTRY'S POLICIES AND PROPOSED SOLUTIONS;

Resume your country's policies and what factors contributed to those policies being established. Address any benefits or detriments of the development of the current policies, specifically if they have taken to maximize or minimize the effects of the issue.

Explain why your country has acted in a certain way historically and why it will continue to follow this course of action or why it should change.

Outline the country interest in the issue, and discuss what needs to be changed quoting the aspects needing reform and provide your suggestions as to how the process should be. (of course this will depend on each country's legislation) As a conclusion write your solutions, describe them, and mention how such solutions will help solve the issue.

D. LOOSE ENDS;

Always be true to your country's belief and respect those guidelines, but feel free to add your own particular touch by adding your own opinion.

End by summing up what you hope to achieve during the conference.
